

Hudson Solid Waste Transfer Station Project Fact Sheet



Project Summary

With the construction of the Hudson Police Department/Public Works Facility in 2017, the Town of Hudson and B-P Trucking, Inc. seek to relocate the existing transfer station operations towards the interior of the 72-acre parcel located at 300 Cox Street, Hudson. The new transfer station will have a permitted capacity of 850 tons per day (TPD), in comparison to the existing facility's capacity of 350 TPD. Once operating, the Town of Hudson and B-P will terminate operation of the existing transfer station.

Project Benefits

The more modern, efficient transfer station will benefit the Town of Hudson and the broader community. The facility will have space to transfer municipal solid waste (MSW) and Construction & Demolition (C&D) material into semi-trailers for offsite disposal or reclamation. The Project will also allow Hudson residents to visit the facility to drop-off MSW and household recyclables in an exterior drop-off area.

The Project will also accept recyclable materials (glass, metal, plastic, paper) and, with the exception of glass, provide for sorting and baling of these materials within the building. Additional benefits include the creation of temporary construction and new full-time jobs, resulting in a positive impact due to construction spending and employment.
